94% of titles are indexed in Scopus and coverage includes: intellectual/learning disabilities, mental health, criminology and forensic practice, working with vulnerable groups and management of services.

The Health and Social Care collection tackles some of the key research questions facing us for the global future: creating parity of physical and mental health, tackling inequalities in healthcare provision, caring for an ageing population, creating healthy workforces and improving patient care whilst delivering value for money.

Downloads increased by 28% in 2014 and with plans to grow the number of articles in the collection by almost a quarter in the two year period 2015/16, it is proving to be an invaluable resource for anyone working or studying in this field.

In addition to a number of respected Health Care Management journals, the full collection contains titles which cover four key topics within the Health and Social Care arena. These sub-collections are also available as separate subscriptions so that institutions and organizations which specialize in these areas can choose the journals with most relevance to their fields of interest.

International Journal of Prisoner Health

Indexed in MEDLINE this journal provides a unique interdisciplinary focus on the health of prisoners, facilitating international research and discussion on experiences from a range of expert authors.

This new applied international journal covers policing, corrections and community justice and provides a unique single outlet for research.

Learning/Intellectual Disabilities

Advances in Autism

Tizard Learning Disability Review

Journal of Public Mental Health

This key title focuses on the research, policy and practice that puts mental well-being at the heart of the public health agenda. It aims to develop the theory underpinning public mental health, and expand our knowledge of best practice in mental health promotion.



Advances in Dual Diagnosis

This journal provides practical information for policymakers, practitioners, researchers and managers to help improve services for people who are dually diagnosed with mental health and substance use problems.

Vulnerable Groups

A wide range of topics in research, policy and practice, with an evidence-based and multidisciplinary approach.
